From My Heart

My dear friends, I have missed seeing you at church these last few weeks and feel like I lost the most important part of Christmas by not enjoying this special time of year in worship with you. My extended illness certainly disrupted my expectations of the season this year.

I am very grateful for the support you have given me during my time away, and I am especially grateful for Janice, the church staff, and so many of you who have stepped up to fill in the gaps in my absence. I hope everyone appreciates what a great staff we have and the exceptional lay leaders at Earle Street who work throughout the year but are also quick to go the extra mile when needed. It is an honor to be a part of such a loving and caring church family.


I want to give you a brief update on my health issues and recovery. On December 17, I had a successful cardiac ablation procedure for my persistent Atrial Fibrillation but had to stay in the hospital for a couple of extra days due to a small complication. A week later, I had a TIA followed by a minor stroke that affected my left arm and hand, possibly due to not taking the blood thinner medicine to prevent clots during and following the ablation procedure. Then a week after that, I developed a systemic infection that sent me back to the hospital for IV antibiotics and after getting home, the infection came roaring back which required another round of IV antibiotics in the hospital. I can identify with the title of the book series by Lemony Snicket, *A Series of Unfortunate Events*!

The good news is that the procedure to treat the AFib seems to be successful, the ill-effects from the stroke are resolving at a good pace, and the infection is under control. In other words, I am feeling good and getting stronger each day. I am hoping to put these complications in the rear-view mirror and move toward a much healthier and vibrant year in 2026.

2026 promises to be a consequential year as we restart the pastor search process and lay the foundation for welcoming a new pastor at Earle Street. This can be a year of building positive momentum and engaging in strengthening the fellowship and ministry of this church.

I look forward to being back with you in worship on January 25th and in getting back to the work God has called us to do.
