### JOIN US ON THE JOURNEYS OF PAUL IN GREECE & TÜRKIYE September 9–22, 2026

Walk in the footsteps of the Apostle Paul as Scripture comes to life across Greece and Türkiye. In Athens, explore the world-renowned Acropolis, the Parthenon, and Erectheum, then stand where Paul once stood on Mars Hill and stroll the ancient agora. See the House of Parliament, Presidential Palace, and the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier before traveling to Corinth, where Paul met Aquilla and Priscilla and received a vision from the Lord. Visit the archaeological museum, the marketplace, and stand on the Bema, where Paul faced charges before Gallio.

In Thessaloniki, discover where Paul was accused of "turning the world upside down" with his preaching of Christ, and visit St. George's Basilica, believed to be built over the synagogue where he once taught. Continue on to Veria, Amphipolis, Philippi, and Neapoli, then journey through Istanbul, Ephesus, Colossae, Laodicea, Cappadocia, and much more.

This unforgettable experience will bring the book of Acts to life before your eyes as you see, stand, and walk where Paul once shared the gospel.
