#### CALLING ALL 3RD - 5TH GRADERS!

Are children too young to serve as worship leaders? My answer is no, which is why we give all 3rd – 5th graders the opportunity to serve as acolytes. The acolytes come in at the beginning of each worship service and light the Christ candle on the communion table. This may seem like a random and unimportant activity, but lighting the Christ candle is a symbol of bringing the light of Christ into our worship. Consequently, the acolyte carries the light of Christ back out of the sanctuary at the end of the service, which symbolizes that we all take the light of Christ out with us.

We began having the children serve as acolytes several years ago. Why 3rd – 5th graders? They are old enough to handle the responsibility, and I've yet to meet a child that didn't like to have a lighter in their hands! We use the acolytes during the school year, from September through May.

## WHY PARTICIPATE IN A CHILDREN'S CHOIR?

Beginning on Wednesday, August 13, we will once again hear the sweet sound of children singing. We have two choirs for children here at Earle Street: Preschool Choir (ages K3-K5), and Young Musicians (1st-5th grades). Why do we believe children's choirs are important, and why should your child participate?

- Choir teaches discipline. Children focus and work together to learn the music.
- Choir teaches working toward a goal. Children work each week to learn their music—not everything is instantaneous.
- Choir teaches using skills. Children are born singers, and choir gives them the opportunity to use that ability.
- Choir, especially at church, teaches children about God. We learn to sing our faith, even before we understand it.
- Choir is fun!

There are many more reasons why choir is important, especially for children. I am grateful for a church that sees the value of choirs for children and supports it with monetary and human resources. It's never too late to join one of our choirs, so if your child is not involved, I hope you will consider it!

Our annual trip to the **Bronx** was another highlight. Visiting the same community year after year allows us to see the ways God is working there—and to build long-term relationships with the kids we serve.

Between trips, we dove into a teaching series called "Unashamed" - equipping students to stand confidently in their faith. We also made time for plenty of local fun—pool parties, a water obstacle course, and our always-anticipated tubing trip (though this year, August surprised us with cooler weather!)

Thank you for your constant prayers and support for our youth. They truly are the future of our faith and our church—and by God's grace, we are in good hands.
