UPDATE FROM THE PASTOR SEARCH COMMITTEE

The Pastor Search Committee has been meeting regularly to interview candidates and continue the Pastor Search Process. We have completed both successful interviews and unsuccessful interviews. We are continuing our process and are still hopeful to maintain our estimated timeline of having a pastor in place by next year.

UPDATE FROM THE DEACON ELECTION TASK FORCE

Thank you so much for your diligence in providing feedback on the 2024 Deacon Election Process. We received 68 feedback forms and the majority of people said they would be in favor of using the process in the future, with several suggestions for "tweaks" to the process. The Deacon Election Task Force has reviewed the feedback and is considering each suggestion. Two comments of note that we want to address now, are the concern over ballot confidentiality and transparency of numbers.

The voting process of signing a name to an envelope was confidential because the person verifying the name against the membership list did not look at the enclosed ballot and the counters did not look at the envelopes. However, the process will be changed in the future to avoid the perception of non-confidentiality. If the church votes to use this process in the future, on election Sunday, voters' names will be compared to the roster of active members and the ballots will be collected anonymously. Absentee ballots will still require a signed envelope, as they have in the past.

Here are some numbers that you have requested: 80 people were nominated. 8 were found to be ineligible (2 were not members of the church and the others were either a family member of a staff member or on the CDN). 50 people attended the informational sessions, and after the sessions, 20 people agreed to serve if elected. From that group, the CDN selected the 9 candidates.

As for the election itself, 171 ballots were cast and all nine candidates were confirmed by at least 75%. There were 10 ballots cast with no votes for any candidate.

The new deacons are hard at work already and we are excited for the new church year. The Deacon Election Task Force will present all of the improvements to the election process at a future church conference.

COOPERATIVE MISSIONS

At the church conference on July 24, 2024, the congregation approved the Missional Partnership Task Force Proposal. Part of that proposal was the change in cooperative missions options. Our church gives 10% of all undesignated (budget) offerings to cooperative missions. Anyone giving to ESBC can choose to designate that portion of their offering to one of the following:

- 1. The ESBC Greater Way Partnership Fund (Default)
- 2. The Baptist World Alliance (BWA) https://baptistworld.org/
- 3. The Cooperative Baptist Fellowship (CBF) https://cbf.net/
- 4. The Southern Baptist Convention Cooperative Program (SBC) https://www.sbc.net
- 5. Gifts divided equally among BWA, CBF, and SBC

The ESBC Greater Way Partnership Fund will be used for additional funding for current mission partners, missions emergencies or spontaneous missions needs that arise, or new missions opportunities. This will be the default option if one of the global mission partners is not chosen, even if you have previously chosen an option.

This change will go into effect with our new church year on September 1, 2024. We have begun to collect decision cards. They are available in the pew racks or you may also make your choice by calling the church office at (864) 233-5332, completing your card online at www.esbcgreenville.org/cooperative-missions, or by contacting Gina Conn at gina@esbcgreenville.org.
