FROM THE PASTOR

January 1 marks the beginning of a new year, my twenty-first anniversary at Earle Street, and a new season in the life and history of our church - - a season between pastors. After January 8, I will no longer be standing behind the historic pulpit in our beautiful sanctuary, but I assure you that I will still be praying for our church during this season of transition. And I will be using this prayer guide each day, as I always have, to join my prayers with yours.

God can be trusted to lead our church through this season of transition, just as God has led our church for more than a hundred years. Pastors come and go, but the church of Jesus Christ moves on. As Paul wrote to the Corinthians about his own ministry among them, and the ministry of Apollos, who succeeded him, "I planted, Apollos watered, but God gave the growth." Of course, there is a role for the pastor to play in the life of the church. But it is God who can be trusted to move the church along.

In addition to praying at your normal time each day, don't forget to pray for our church at 12:12 each day (see Romans 12:12). There is something special about knowing that we are all praying at the same time for the same reason. The Deacons and Nominating Committee have specifically given us these specific prayer requests:

- Remain joyful in hope for our future.
- Remain patient as we go through transition and seek God's guidance.
- Remain faithful in praying for our church and its leadership.
- We all love our church and we love one another. Please pray that love will prevail in all our interactions.
- We ask prayer for unity in our fellowship and that God will lead us into unity of purpose and understanding of each other and of our mission.
- As we "wait on the Lord's guidance," pray that we will humbly follow God's leadership as we take actions.
- We ask God for patience for our entire congregation as we seek to fulfill our responsibilities according to God's desires for our church.
- We pray for wisdom, discernment, and inspiration from the Lord.
- We pray for forbearance, open hearts and minds, and trust in each other and in the process of finding our way forward at ESBC.
- We ask you to pray for good relations among our congregation as our work moves forward. May peace and love prevail in all our endeavors during our period of transition.

Serving our church for the past twenty-one years has been the greatest honor of my life; and if we will all unite in constant and focused prayer during this transition time, I believe that the church's best days are not behind us, but ahead of us.

From the Prayer Team - In a Time of Transition

Whether we recognize it or not, each day of our lives – each moment – is a time of transition. We are constantly on the move, from a familiar past and present, into an unknown future. We don't know what may happen tomorrow. Our heavenly Father does. Not only does God know the future – He *controls* it.

James 4:14-15 - you do not know what tomorrow will bring... Instead, you ought to say, "If the Lord wills..."

God is in control; His wisdom is infinite, and His love for us is perfect. Because this is true, we can trust God. We must place our faith in God alone, who can never fail. Then, even in troubled times, we can live without fear.

As we pray regarding the pastor God will send, above all, we must seek God's will for our church family.

The Lord is our Shepherd; He is the only source of our provision and protection. He leads, guides, and directs His flock. We depend on God to provide us with fresh wisdom for *this* decision - wisdom we have never had before and never needed until now.

Psalms 127:1 – “Unless the LORD builds the house, the builders labor in vain.”

Our Pastor Search Committee and other leaders will make wise decisions as our whole church prays together in unity, seeking God's will, and yielding our will to His perfect will. Let us pray that God will reveal His will and grant us discernment in His perfect timing, along with the endurance to follow Him.

Matthew 6:8 – “Your Father knows what you need before you ask him.”

God knows what our needs will be six months or two years from now; we don't.

Proverbs 3:5-6 – “Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding. In all your ways acknowledge Him, and He shall direct your paths.”

Each of us is a unique creation of God, with different gifts, experiences, and perspectives. In 1 Corinthians 12, Paul describes how we are one body with many members.

But how can we all pray together in unity when we are all so different? Paul answered this question in 1 Corinthians 13. Paul tells us the most excellent way – the only way – is to truly love one another.

Don't forget how our story ends. Heaven will be our home. Sometimes we think of heaven as a country, a kingdom, a beautiful paradise. But it is also our Father's house. John 14:2 says that we will dwell together as God's family in His home. We will share close, intimate relationships, unspoiled by sin.

Today we are aliens and strangers, pilgrims passing through this world. We are citizens of heaven, our true eternal home. We will live in the presence of our Redeemer forever.

3. “I shall recount the Lord's unfailing love.” Lord, when we tell others about you, fill our mouths with your truth. (Isa 63:7)
4. Guide us in our studies, Lord. We delight in your works. (Ps 111:2)
5. “The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom, and they who live by it will grow in understanding.” Amen, my king! (Ps 111:10)
6. We at ESBC are grateful to be joined to you, Lord, and we delight in our unity with each other. Please guide our transition period.
7. God, you have set the spirit of Christ in our hearts. Be near us as we whisper, moan, croak, or cry to you: “Abba, Father!” (Gal 4:6)
8. “I have formed you, and destined you to be a light for peoples, a lamp for nations, to open eyes that are blind.” Make us fearless advocates of your shalom, Lord. (Isa 42:6)
9. “The Lord will give strength to his people.” Praise God! (Ps 29:11)
10. We are no longer slaves to sin, Lord. Thank you for your sacrifice “once, for all,” my king! (Rom 6:10-11)
11. Lord God, king of the universe, we confess that Jesus is indeed your beloved son, with whom you are well pleased. (Mat 3:17)
12. When Jesus saw need, he acted to meet the need. Lord, may we not be passive in our love. Give us hearts for service.
