### FROM THE PASTOR Stephen Clyborne

This Sunday, September 11, will be an important date for a several reasons.

It was twenty-one years ago on September 11 that our country was attacked in one of the most horrific acts of terrorism imaginable. Most of us remember where we were when we first heard the news. It was a day that we must always remember and never forget. The following Sunday twenty-one years ago, churches were packed as unprecedented numbers of people came together in worship and acknowledged our need for God. Not long ago, I read a study that showed that that date marked the last time at least 6 in 10 Americans had confidence in the church (68 percent). Since then, American's confidence and trust in the church has been steadily declining, reaching an all-time low of 31 percent in 2022. It is a shame that many people recognize the need for church only when they are in a crisis. But as I said in the sermon last Sunday about worship, what we do on the so-called "ordinary" Sundays shapes and forms us more than what we do on the so-called "extraordinary" Sundays.

So I hope you will be present this Sunday as Jay Roland, our new Connections Minister, continues our sermon series entitled "Reaffirming Our Mission and Renewing Our Covenant." He will be focusing on the second phrase in our church's mission statement: "to share the gospel of Jesus Christ in word and deed." If there has ever been a time when we needed to reaffirm that part of our mission statement, it is now. And who better to lead us in that focus than the staff minister who will be responsible for coordinating our church's mission efforts? This will be Jay's first sermon in our church, and I hope you will be present to worship God and to support Jay.

Also, this Sunday, September 11, our newly organized clusters will be meeting to organize, plan, and pray for our new church year. If you are a part of these clusters, I hope you will make a special effort to be present at the appropriate time. And if you cannot be present, I hope you will ask someone to represent your entity at the cluster meeting. These meetings will be essential as we get our church year off to a strong start.
