OUR JOURNEY IN FAITH STRATEGIC PLAN 2022 TO BE PRESENTED TO THE CONGREGATION

At the conclusion of the worship service on Sunday, August 7, the Strategic Planning Committee will be presenting "Our Journey in Faith, Strategic Plan 2022." Copies of the report with recommendations will be distributed at that time. On Wednesday, August 10, the congregation will be invited to the Fellowship Hall at 6:15 p.m. to discuss the proposed strategic plan. And on Sunday, August 14, during the 10:30 a.m. worship service, the church will vote on the plan without discussion.

The strategic plan is the result of a process that began in January 2021 with a proposal to the deacons; and on May 23, 2021, the congregation approved the concept of an open-ended method of challenging ourselves to hear what the Holy Spirit has to say to us about where we have come from, where we are now, and where we should be in the future. This report reflects what the Strategic Planning Committee has heard from members of the congregation through surveys and group discussions. The final report includes recommendations and referrals to help us grow into the next hundred years as the people of Earle Street Baptist Church. We hope you will be present to consider the Strategic Planning Committee's report to the congregation.


