ESBC Family,

Paul's letters to his protégé Timothy have always fascinated me. In these letters, we have a record of what the church's earliest leaders were thinking and doing. As is typical of Paul, his letter opens with a greeting, a report of the situation, and prayer. Immediately after this opening, Paul lets Timothy know what the churches in Ephesus first priority should be.

I love the way that Eugene Peterson translated the first three verses of chapter 2, "The first thing I want you to do is pray. Pray every way you know how, for everyone you know. Pray especially for rulers and their governments to rule well so we can be quietly about our business of living simply, in humble contemplation. This is the way our Savior God wants us to live." (1 Timothy 2.1-3, MSG) Take a moment to read that passage in your favorite translation!

Slow down and notice the emphasis on prayer. Church family, thank you for joining us in praying for the future of our church, but let's not stop there. Let's pray for one another. Let's seek out people in our communities who need prayer. Let's pray for those who are near to us but far from God. Let's pray for our governmental leaders (local, state, national). Let's be people who pray.

I hope to see you at our Prayer Breakfast on Saturday, February 4th at 9:00 am. A special thank you to our Prayer Team and other volunteers who are putting this together! As Paul pointed out, there is nothing more urgent than prayer.
