AN OPEN LETTER TO OUR CHURCH FAMILY

Dear Beloved Church Family,

We are writing this letter because we are devastated that our church has become so divided, and that people whom we dearly love have left. We have always had church members who were polar opposites on many views, but we have always been able to agree that Jesus Christ is Lord, and that He is the one who unites us. Somewhere along the way we started talking *about* each other instead of talking *to* each other.

There have been a lot of rumors going around about things the staff has said or done. Many of the things we have been accused of have been far-fetched and would be laughable, except that people have chosen to believe them and spread them around. This has been particularly hurtful.

We are very disappointed that folks have chosen to believe these things without ever asking any of us if what they heard was true. We beg you, if you have any questions or concerns about the staff, or other entities in our church, please, *please* come and talk to us. We are all willing to have open and honest conversations with you. We promise we are seeking God's will for our church and our next pastor.

In closing, we have been reminded of the letters from John. At the end of his life, the Apostle John, after all he had seen and experienced with Jesus and in his exile, kept coming back to a phrase that he repeated over and over:

Dear children, let us love one another. Brothers and sisters, let us love one another. Let us love one another. May it be so.

> FROM THE CHAIRPERSONS OF THE DEACONS AND THE NOMINATING COMMITTEE

On Sunday evening, Oct 22, John Kincaid submitted his resignation from his role as a deacon and as Chairman of the Search Committee. DEACON OF THE WEEK

AN UPDATE FROM THE DEACONS

The deacons met on October 8th and October 22nd. These meetings included a time of collective prayer for each other, the ESBC congregation, and prayers of gratitude for the blessings we experience at ESBC.

Items discussed and voted on during the October 8th meeting included:

- unanimous vote to sell ESBC activity buses
- unanimous vote to delay the filling of two vacant deacon positions until the Deacon Election Task Force has had time to review and potentially propose a change to the method of electing ESBC deacons
- unanimous vote to approve the Property and Space Committee motion to use the 2023 Richard and Marion Bramlett Fund distribution for the renovation of the meeting space of the Family Life Center
- positive reports from September cluster meetings detailing the continued success of the entities at ESBC

Items discussed during the October 22nd meeting included:

- outrageous success of the Great Earle Pumpkin Patch in terms of both funds raised for mission trips and opportunities to interact with our neighbors
- discussion of the proposed 2024 budget being prepared by the Stewardship Committee
- update from the first meeting of the Deacon Election Task Force

In addition to the items listed above, the Deacons voted in favor of designating Gary Strickland as an intentional interim pastor, with all duties associated with that position, including but not limited to, providing consulting services to the Pastor Search Committee, staff oversight, and leading a transition process. This vote was taken to affirm the duties that Gary has been performing effective July 1, 2023.
